

Burn Check List

Before you burn you **MUST** notify the following:

- 1. Kendall County 830-896-1133
- 2. Kerr County 830-249-9721
- 3. Your neighbors
- 4. A Fire Awareness Team Member (See the list below)

IF THE FIRE GETS OUT OF CONTROLL CALL 911!

Also notify the Fire Awareness Team Member.

Burn Check List:

- Observe the burn ban sign at the front of the gate
- · Have the Fire Awareness Team list available

Check the Weather Forecast. Wind speeds during the Burn should be under 10mph

 Make certain the area around the brush pile is clear of dry vegetation for a minimum of 10 feet and

choose your burn location with Fire Truck accessibility in mind

- · Have a water hose or other source of water ready and functional at the fire site
- There must be someone present at all times at your burn pile until the fire is completely put out.

The fire is deemed out when you take water and douse the ashes soaking them completely!

- Items that may be burned are yard clippings, tree limbs/cuttings, and trees which have been cut down and cut into manageable logs
- Plastic/synthetic materials, household trash, and rubber are not permitted to be burned
